*Sustainability, Artificial Intelligence, and Immersive Technologies in
the Transformation of the Tourism Experience*

University of Naples December 9, 2026

Conference Theme

The “Tourism Futures” conference, which kicks off the 8th edition of ScOUT—School of Methodology and Socio-Cultural and Territorial Research on Tourism—is dedicated to the future of tourism and the transformations brought about by advanced technologies. Artificial intelligence, robotics, digital platforms, big data, and immersive technologies are redefining tourism experiences, the representation of places, and destination governance, raising new social, cultural, economic, ethical, and territorial issues. The conference aims to foster interdisciplinary reflection on the opportunities and challenges of these processes, in relation to the principles of sustainability, inclusion, accessibility, and territorial responsibility. Particular attention will be given to the sea, coastal areas, and island destinations, as prime contexts for observing and experimenting with current and future models of use, management, and technological protection of these territories. Organized in collaboration with the scientific journal “Fuori Luogo,” the call for abstracts is open to scholars from various disciplinary fields. We invite theoretical, methodological, and empirical contributions, case studies, comparative analyses, and applied experiences that explore the relationship between tourism, technological innovation, and future scenarios. The contributions deemed most meritorious by the Scientific Committee will be selected for publication in a special issue of the journal “Fuori Luogo” dedicated to the conference’s themes.

Contributions are welcome from the social sciences, humanities, economics, regional studies, computer science, and any other disciplinary field relevant to the themes of this call.

Thematic Areas

- **Sustainability of territories and seas:** governance of destinations and common goods; processes of touristification and overtourism; coastal, marine, and mountain areas; parks and protected natural areas; cultural and natural heritage; models of sustainable and regenerative tourism development.
- **Artificial Intelligence, Data, and Automation:** generative AI and large language models (LLMs); recommendation algorithms; predictive analytics; service personalization; ethics, transparency, and accountability; digital methods for tourism analysis.
- **Accessibility, Inclusion, and Social Justice:** physical, cognitive, linguistic, and sociocultural barriers; universal design; the right to tourism and the travel experience; community participation; territorial equity; policies for accessible and inclusive tourism

Participation and Submission of Proposals

This call is open to faculty members, researchers, research fellows, contract researchers, scholarship recipients, doctoral candidates, and young scholars. Contributions from sociology, geography, economics, urban and territorial studies, media studies, computer science, heritage studies, and related disciplines are encouraged.

Abstract: 300–500 words, in Italian or English.

Required elements: title; author's name, affiliation, and contact information; 4–5 keywords; chosen thematic area; brief biographical note (maximum 100 words); and whether the presentation will be online or in person.

Presentation format: 10-minute presentation, in person or online.
